




A Word From Pastor Rudy

Happy December to you all! It's hard to believe that we are at the end of the year and into the season of Advent. During this time of waiting and anticipation of the coming of Christ, it is good to reflect on this past year. Together, we live in the hope that comes to us at the end of Advent, the birth of Christ who brings eternal life with God.

One of my favorite Christmas hymns that I remember learning in elementary school is actually an Advent hymn, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel." I'm not sure why it has always stuck out to me as favorite, but I think it has to do with the words of the first verse, "O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, that mourns in lonely exile here until the Son of God appear. We are invited to pause, be still, and be fully present in this holy season. Society calls us to a different place where busyness, spending, and rushing about are marks of success. God, in Christ, offers another way: Emmanuel – God with us.

- What can I add to this season that would truly allow me to pause?
- What tradi2on do you have that nurtures being present at this 2me of year?
- As you are on the GO, how are you going to prac2ce being present?

Prayer: Emmanuel, you are present with us. Help us be present with each other. Amen.
