

A Word From Pastor Rudy

Grace and peace to you all! Amen.

This year, Easter is a bit early coming on March 31. Our journey will begin on Ash Wednesday. We will also be having our midweek Lenten services using the Holden Evening Prayer. I invite you to come and be a part of this mediative service. We will also have a High School Youth led contemporary Service of the Word on the first Sunday of February. 


A Picture Perfect Christmas




SOUPER BOWL OF CARING


Sanctuary Stained Glass Windows
